## **ORDINANCE NO 2014-07**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF GREENCASTLE, FRANKLIN COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA AMENDING CHAPTER 190 ENTITLED "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC" OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF GREENCASTLE BY ELIMINATING THE LOCATION OF A CERTAIN PARKING SPACE

WHEREAS, the Borough of Greencastle desires to eliminate the location of a certain parking space within the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the Borough of Greencastle deems it in the best interest, and for the general welfare of the citizens and residents of the Borough to amend certain provisions of Chapter 190 of the Borough of Greencastle.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Greencastle, Franklin County, Pennsylvania, and it is enacted and ordained as follows:

**SECTION I**: Chapter 190 of the Code of the Borough of Greencastle, entitled "Vehicles and Traffic", Section 27 thereof, entitled "Parking Prohibited At All Times In Certain Locations", Subsection A thereof, is hereby amended by the addition of the following:

Street Side Location

E. Baltimore Street South From the intersection of E. Baltimore Street and the South side of Center Square a distance of 37 feet.

**SECTION II**: REPEALER. All provisions of previous Ordinances of the Borough of Greencastle which are contrary to this Ordinance are expressly repealed.

**SECTION III**: **SAVINGS CLAUSE.** In all other respects, Chapter 190 of the Code Borough of Greencastle shall remain as previously enacted and ordained.

**SECTION IV: SEVERABILITY.** The provisions of this Ordinance are severable and if any of its sections, clauses, or sentences shall be held illegal, invalid, or unconstitutional, such provisions shall not affect or impair any of the remaining sections, clauses or sentences.

**SECTION VI:** EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately.
