Regular meeting, June 4, 1934, Council Hall, 8:00 P. M.

The regular June meeting of Council was held in Council Hall at 8:00 P. M. on the above date.

Present: Pres. W. Earl Gardner, Burgess, D. W. Shinham, and Councilmen Seibert, Davison, Gilland, Davison and Stover, Walck.

Mr. S. V. Humbert appeared before Council and asked that the alley near his property be repaired. The matter was referred to the Street Committee.

Mr. John Rife asked that Council use its influence to have the 33,000 volt line of the South Penn Power Co. moved outside the Borough limits. He stated that this line was a hazard in case of fire and created radio intereference. The fact that the line was being rebuilt, he stated, should be a good time to get action this matter.

Minutes of the last regular meeting were read by the secretary, and approved as correct.

Treasurer Chas. W. Bert, Jr. reported as follows:-

Following a discussion concerning the electric line referred to by Mr. Rife, the secretary was instructed to confer with Mr. Hoke to determine the Borough's rights in this matter, also to confer with the power company if necessary.

Police Chief Ambrose, made a detailed report in which he stated that nine arrests had been made during the month of May.

The secretary read a letter from the State Highway Department stating that this department had no approved grades for curbs along State highways in the Borough, and also stating that the curb was not on their right of way, and that they therefore had no jurisdiction ove the same.

A detailed report by Treas. Bert, indicated that the receipts of the Borough would be approximately \$6,000.00 less this year than last year, and if work were not curtailed considerably, it would be necessary to make a loan from the bank or some other source before the end of the year. Action on the above; a motion by Mr. Stover, Seconded by Dr. Seibert was passed stating that except for work of an emergency nature, no new work should be started by

any department without the approval of Council.

The matter of permitting Wm. Finfrock to work out taxes owed by his land-lord was brought before Council, but no action taken.

On motion the Water Manager was authorized to refund to Dr. J. P. Stover the sum of \$13.93; this amount being due him on account of the installation of a water meter.

The treasurer pointed out that there was not sufficient money in the bond treasury to meet current demands, and on motion, he was authorized to transfer \$ 200.00 as a loan from the regular borough account. This amount to be returned to the Borough account as soon as possible.

The secretary called attention to the fact that recent changes made for the purpose of drying the fire hose had destroyed the closed in which borough records had been kept, and asked that a suitable closet be provided for the storgae of borough maps, and other records. He was instructed to make and investigation as to the most suitable place to store these records and report at next meeting.

It was stated that a dump on the grounds of the Moss Spring Land improvement Co. at the East end of town was creating a fire hazard and nuisance. The secretary was asked to confer with the owners and ask that they permit the borough police to co-operate with them in stopping this nuisance.

Water Manager Bert, explained that it would be advisable at the Landistool company to permit this company to connect their fire line direct to the water mains without passing thru the meter. This would give better water pressure in case of fire, and would eliminate objections raised by the dep't of underwriters. On motion Dr. Seibert, seconded by Mr. Stover, the Landis Co. was given permission to make this change, with the understanding that only fire hydrants be connected to this line, and that the water be used only in case of fire.
