

Regular Meeting, Oct. 1, 1934

Council Hall, 7:30 P. M.

The regular October meeting of council was held on the above date with the following present:-

Burgess, D. W. Shinham and councilmen Stover, Davison, Hoachlander, Gilland, Seibert, & Walck.

Burgess Shinham called the meeting to order and stated that an election would be held to fill the vacancy in council caused by the death of W. Earl Gardner. The name of Harry Friedly was placed in nomination, and there being nor other nominations, a vote was taken by acclamation. The vote resulted in the unanimous election of Mr. Friedly. Mr. Friedly was present and was immediately sworn in by the Burgess.

Nominations for President of Council were next asked for. The name of L. R. Walck was placed in nomination, and upon a vote being taken was declared unanimously elected. Mr. Walk, then took the chair and presided.

Mr. Elmer Fries stated to council that a change made in the grade of sidewalks in the East End had caused storm water to run over his pavement, and asked that some relief be given.

Minutes of the last regular meeting were read and approved without correction.

Mr. Devison of the Public Prop committee was authorized to appoint a new attendant and that the salary be same as before, but payable quarterly. Back salary due the former janitor was ordered paid.

Water Manager Bert reported bids for electrifying the Moss Spring pumping station, but on account of the increase in the spring flow at the reservoir, it was felt that there was no immediate need for this improvement, and no action was taken.
