

Greencastle Pa April 16th 1880

Council Met at the Office of W. F. Patton at Seven o'clock P. M. for the purpose of organization - Present Benjamin Best, Benjamin, C. F. Bonner, Andrew Stiffel, John Michelin, George W. Brumbaugh, John Koons and Jacob S. Fleming - The Oath being first duly sworn by John G. Wallace, a Justice of the Peace, thereupon proceeded to administer the Oath of Office to the members of Council, all of whom were duly sworn or affirmed - The Council thereupon proceeded to the election of an attorney and clerk at a salary of \$25.⁰⁰ and W. F. Patton was duly elected, and sworn by the Benjers - H. P. Prather was elected Treasurer at a salary of \$20.⁰⁰, S. F. Gorman was elected Policeman at a salary of Ten dollars per month, John Missary was elected Clock Minder at a salary of \$12 per year - S. F. Gorman was elected Lamp Lighter at a salary of Seven ⁵⁰/₁₀₀ Dollars per month - The High Constables Bond was fixed at \$150.⁰⁰ and his salary at \$24 per year. The Benjers then appointed the following Committees, viz:

On motion then made John Michelin was elected President of the Council. On motion the Secretary was directed to procure a Minute Book for use of Council. The last Friday night of each month

was then fixed as the night of regular meeting
of Council. John Wilhelm then withdrew from
the meeting leaving in the hands of the Burgers
his written resignation of the Office of Council.
for the reason that he had served the Borough
in Office continuously, with the exception of a
single year, for 33 years. On motion made
it was unanimously agreed that the resi-
gnation should not be accepted -

Palmer for hauling to dali - for \$120. On motion
it was ordered that the Burgers shall not permit to have
for the Bank go out of his hands except upon a regular
organization of the Bank. On motion adjourned
to meet Friday evening May 7th at 7 o'clock P.M.
